South East Local Health Integration Network Multi-Year Accessibility Plan (2017-2021)

Introduction

In 2005, the Government of Ontario passed the *Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act, 2005* (AODA) with the goal of making Ontario accessible by 2025. With the legislation comes phased in accessibility standards that businesses and organizations in Ontario must embrace, and commit to meeting, so that people with disabilities have more opportunities to participate in everyday life. The South East Local Health Integration Network (LHIN) strives to meet accessibility and accommodation requirements as prescribed in the AODA.

Under the AODA, the following accessibility standards set requirements that are applicable to the South East LHIN:

- Information and Communications;
- Employment;
- · Design of Public Spaces; and
- Customer Service.

Statement of Commitment

The South East LHIN is committed to treating all people in a way which allows them to maintain their dignity and independence. We believe in integration and equal opportunity. We are committed to meeting the needs of people with disabilities in a timely manner, and will do so by preventing and removing barriers to accessibility, and meeting accessibility requirements under the AODA.

Plan Purpose and Overview

The multi-year plan outlines the South East LHIN's strategy to prevent and remove barriers and improve opportunities for people with disabilities. The South East LHIN will act conscientiously and in keeping with its own policies and with relevant legislation.

In accordance with the requirements set out in the Integrated Accessibility Standards Regulation (IASR), the South East LHIN will:

- Establish, review and update this plan in consultation with persons with disabilities;
- Post this plan on its website;
- Report as required on its website on the progress of the implementation of this plan;
- Provide this plan in an accessible format, upon request; and
- Review and update this plan at least once every five years.
