The Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care has provided one-time funding to the Community Mental Health & Addictions (CMH&A) sector for the financial software, *Microsoft Dynamics GP*. Through the Community Care Information Management CMH&A Management Information Systems (CMH&A MIS) project, Health Service Providers (HSPs) across the sector have taken this opportunity to adopt the software. On adoption of the software, organizations receive a lifetime license, comprehensive hands-on training and implementation support

The CMH&A MIS project is now nearing completion and Microsoft Dynamics GP will be available at no cost to the sector <u>until March 31, 2010.</u>

HSPs that still plan to adopt the software need to sign a letter of commitment and submit it to the CMH&A MIS project before <u>March 31, 2010</u>. They will then have until <u>September 30, 2010</u> to transition and "Go Live" with the software. The project team will be available to provide transition support until the end of September 2010.

HSPs that have not yet decided whether to implement Microsoft Dynamics GP should speak to a member of the CMH&A MIS project team for additional information and to discuss their specific business needs.
